CLOTHING AND KIT LIST FOR NEW BOYS

House Notes 2020



MARKING

All items, including home clothes, must be clearly marked with the boy's initials and surname; articles requiring washing must also have the House laundry mark (N) and the boy's number after the name (e.g. J.Bloggs N14). The School's outfitters will do this on items purchased from them. Please use nametapes (no 7) in red on white for clothes; marking in pen is not acceptable. Please ensure that shirts are marked at the back of the collar, socks on the leg, and underpants/boxers on the waistband. Rugby shirts, Harrow football shirts and shorts should also be marked with a tape carrying the boy's initials in blue. These are available from either of the School outfitters. Please sew nametapes on fully and not in loops.

Please send Matron at least 50 nametapes before the start of term. Boys should take any new items purchased during the term to Matron for marking.

FURNISHINGS

Each room is fully fitted with all necessary furniture, so nothing extra is needed. There is a safe under the desk and a waste-paper basket will be provided.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

Appliances such as hairdryers, sandwich makers, fan heaters, fridges and kettles constitute fire risks and are not permitted. Music systems should be small and quiet.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS

- 1 House Harrow football shirt
- 1 set of cricket whites
- 1 torch
- 1 Newlands sport shirt
- 1 Newlands hooded sweatshirt
- 1 Newlands athletics vest
- 1 alarm clock
- 1 wash bag (toothbrush etc; roll-on deodorant rather than spray; athlete's foot powder for prevention)

- 1 mug, plate, knife, fork and spoon
- Some hangers
- 3 padlocks (for study desk and locker)
- 1 black trouser belt
- 2 boxer bags
- Any specialist sports kit e.g. swimming goggles
- Flip flops for shower
- Airtight container for snack food

TRUNKS

Please do not bring a trunk; they are too cumbersome, cause too much damage and take up too much storage space. Soft bags work best, with a small one for exeats.

STORAGE

Boys will need to take everything home at Easter and in the summer, when the House is let; only boys from abroad will be able to store their belongings.

INSURANCE

The School insurance does not cover mobile phones or music systems. We suggest you enquire if your son's items can be covered on your personal or house insurance.

HOME CLOTHES

New boys usually arrive in casual clothes which may then be worn in the House in the evenings and at weekends. Don't bring too much to start with. A jacket and tie will be needed for trips off the Hill, for which older boys will require a suit.

HATS
